*Students must demonstrate that they have covered the content in all courses in the program. However, students who have completed coursework in a graduate or undergraduate program may waive comparable courses in their Mason licensure certificate program down to a minimum of 15 credits.

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Internship (https://education.gmu.edu/teacher-track-office/student-internship):

EDSE 783 Internship: Two internship experiences are required for licensure certificate programs: one at the elementary level and one at the secondary level. Internship options should be discussed with an advisor upon admission to the program.

Some students may be eligible to waive one internship experience. For more information on the requirements for the waiver and the documentation that a student must submit in order to request the waiver see the checklist on the internship webpage.

<u>Non-course Requirements</u> (<u>http://cehd.gmu.edu/teacher/test/</u>): VCLA and CPR/AED/First Aid training are required prior to applying for internship. RVE must be completed prior to graduation from the certificate and/or submitting for VDOE licensure.

Tuition Assistance and Grant Funding:

Cohort program (<u>https://education.gmu.edu/special-education-cohort/</u>): The Special Education program works collaboratively with a number of Northern Virginia school divisions to offer special education certificates and degree programs to school employees using a cohort model. This model provides convenience to the students and forms a better link between academia and school realities. Additional benefits of the cohort model include tuition discounts, classes located in the students' school divisions and course scheduling in alignment with school division calendars.

Virginia Educator Discount (<u>https://cehd.gmu.edu/admissions/funding-sources-discounts/educator-tuition-discount</u>): A 15% discount off the university's approved tuition rate is available for qualifying in-state graduate students who are educators in Virginia.

Graduate Research Assistantships (<u>https://cehd.gmu.edu/resources/student/ga-application</u>): Part time positions are available for students interested in providing research support to faculty.
