Vision Statement

Individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities have inclusive, individualized and authentic postsecondary experiences on Virginia college and university campuses that lead to successful career and life paths.



Principles

- Awareness exists about the need for inclusive postsecondary opportunities for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities
- Students with intellectual and developmental disabilities routinely choose to pursue postsecondary education opportunities in preparation of having a career of their choice.
- Virginia colleges/universities are supported in offering individualized and diverse opportunities for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to benefit from higher education.



Principles

- A climate is fostered of learning experiences within an inclusive postsecondary educational setting for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, university students, faculty, and staff.
- A braiding and blending of funds, resources and policies exists and is no longer a barrier to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities pursuing higher education.
