

Goals of the Program

- Develop a program of study and system of supports through partnerships
- Recruit a cohort of 20 students with ID from local schools
- Develop year 1 competencies related to career exploration through Person Centered Planning (PCP) and Exploratory Major
- Develop year 2 and 3 competencies related to career preparation through academic coursework, career and technical education, and community experiences
- Support year 4 transition to employment & community participation through partnerships
