

Typical Students

- Co-ed 18-25 years old
- Diagnosed with Intellectual Disability
- Currently VT residents, from varying living situations
- Meet System of Care criteria



Options within the Housing Component

- Community House
- Transition Apartments
- Section 8



Main House

- Live with UVM grad student (RA)
- Intensive independent living skill support from staff
- Students with more significant needs
- Student driven
- Community House status



Transition Apartments

- Live with a roommate
- College Apartments
- Check-in support





Section 8

- Collaboration with housing authorities
- Subsidized rent
- Student on lease and utilities
- Long term benefits
- Staff support



Tools for Success

- Roommate Agreement
- Use of Technology
- Med Accountability Calendar



Roommate Agreement

- Students come in with varying expectations
- Empowers students
- Student driven, collaborative process
- Cleaning/house responsibilities, Visitors, Disagreements, Study/sleep hours, Messages and mail, Respect, Fun



Use of Technology

• Cell phones

- Requirement
- Social aspect
- Emergency Use
- Practical benefits (set as alarm, reminders, calendar...)

• Safety Connection

- Electronic Safety Devices
- Unobtrusive
- Promotes Feelings of Security for Student and Parents



Med Accountability Calendar

- Innovative medication model
- Students self administer medication
- Personal accountability
- Collaboration with agency nurse

- Funding
- Expectations
- Fears



Funding

- Blend Funding Sources
 - Medicaid Waiver, Grants, Social Security Income,
 Vocational Rehabilitation, Public Schools, Children's
 Personal Care, Private Pay
- Don't be afraid to ask
- Opportunities within State Structure
- Data = Funding



Expectations

- People will do what you expect of them
- Raise awareness with potential students, parents and schools
 - High expectations from the get go promotes success
 - Expect the same from students with disabilities as you do from students without disabilities, but provide appropriate accommodations
- Expect Students to be involved in decisions about their life from a young age



Fears

- Vulnerable Population
 - Decrease vulnerability by preparing students for real life situations
- Dignity of Risk
 - Everyone has a right to make mistakes
 - We learn from our mistakes
 - Intervening if there's a safety issue
- Student, Parental and Community Fears
