

Jeff Gorrell is Professor Emeritus in the College of Education and Human Development at George Mason University. Born in Kentucky, he received his B.A. in English at Vanderbilt University, followed by an M.A. in English at the University of Florida. He received his PhD in Educational Psychology also at the University of Florida. His professional career took him to Southeastern Louisiana University, Auburn University and George Mason University, where he was dean of the College for 7 years, eventually retiring as a faculty member in his academic specialty. In 1987, he was awarded a Fulbright scholarship to Sri Lanka which led to his conducting research with the Ministry of Education over a 12-year period related to cognitive growth of Sri Lankan children. In addition, in the USA he conducted and published extensive research on cognitive modeling and teacher efficacy.
