Business Manager, Apple FCU Foundation

Thomas M. (Mike) Engley has championed students, teachers and learning over a five-decade career in education. He's spent the past ten years promoting the value of philanthropy to transform the lives of those in the educational community. In 2006, as the first executive director of the Apple FCU Foundation, Mr. Engley established an ambitious scholarship program supporting community-minded high school graduates as they make their way to college. Through his leadership, the Foundation has donated over half a million dollars to its Apple Scholars program.

Additionally, he is a strong advocate for teachers, particularly those newest to the profession who often struggle with increased challenges as they enter the classroom for the first time. In 2008, under his direction, the Foundation embarked on a grant program to guide beginning educators with targeted staff development and highly trained mentors. Since 2008, the Foundation has supported over 30,000 new teachers in 12 northern Virginia school divisions with over \$3 million dollars, impacting close to a 200,000 students. He currently serves as the Foundation's Business Manager, retiring as Executive Director in 2015.

Mr. Engley's career positions in Fairfax County Public Schools spanned from classroom teacher to principal to assistant superintendent. He was principal at Lee High School (1993-1998), the school from which he graduated a generation earlier. One of his accomplishments as principal was to establish Apple FCU's first student-run branch, a program that has since grown to 32 branches. Following his retirement from FCPS in 2002, Mr. Engley worked for Apple FCU as a business development consultant and served as a member of Apple's Supervisory Committee. He was appointed executive director of Apple's Education Foundation in 2006 and was elected to Apple's Board of Directors in 2009.

Mr. Engley holds a M.A. from Virginia Tech and a B.A from Salem College (West Virginia). He resides in Potomac Falls, Virginia with his wife, Cheryl.

R.C. Bosley, Treasurer Apple FCU Foundation

R.C. Bosley is clearly an outstanding professional educator whose kind manner, ready smile and warm demeanor belie the fact that this man is a serious numbers guy. He's never met an Excel spread sheet that he can't collate, calculate and cross-reference.

Serving as Treasurer of the Apple FCU Foundation's Board of Directors, Mr. Bosley has been a trusted guardian of the financials underpinning the organization's successful operation.

Additionally, he's brought his expertise to bear on the selection process for the Foundation's annual scholarship program, applying a statistical analysis that involves 30 judges through two rounds of scoring. Around scholarship time, you'll find him in his home office surrounded by a wall of Excel charts.

Since Apple Scholars began in 2008, Mr. Bosley's managed over 3500 applications applying the law of numbers to objectively select 329 finalists. This is a process rooted in the belief that each student who applies deserves a fair shot. We can't imagine any other scholarship competition that is judged with such care and know-how.

R.C. Bosley spent the first five years of his career in Fairfax County Public Schools as a math teacher at Whittier Intermediate (now Falls Church High School). From there, he served in many leadership positions in district offices and schools. He was principal at Ft. Hunt Elementary and Kilmer, Franklin and Thoreau middle schools. He was a coordinator of instruction and area administrator. Following his retirement in 1989, Mr. Bosley was interim principal at two high schools, two middle schools and three elementary schools.

Mr. Bosley holds a B.S. degree from Abilene Christian University (Texas) and a M.Ed. from the University of Virginia. He completed postgraduate work at the University of Virginia, American University, College of William & Mary, Radford University, Vanderbilt University, George Washington University and George Mason University.
