GG5 520 Geography for Teachers Emphasis on problems and techniques in teaching geography and current developments in research, methodology, and philosophy in the discipline.	
HIST 510 Approaches to Modern World History Introduction to the historical study of world history beyond Europe and the United States. Students read major theoretical works as well as case studies of particular regions.	
HIST 601 Themes in U.S. History I Survey of U.S. history prior to 1877. Designed for individuals who need to strengthen their preparation in this area or who seek to enhance their knowledge of the latest interpretations in the field.	
HIST 602 Themes in U.S. History II Survey of U.S. history from 1877 to the present. Designed for individuals who need to strengthen their preparation in this area or who seek to enhance their knowledge of the latest interpretations in the field.	
HIST 605 Themes in European History I Survey of European history from 1500 to 1815. Designed for individuals who need to strengthen their preparation in the area or who seek to enhance their knowledge of the latest interpretations in the field.	
HIST 695 History Symposium This course will focus on one area within world history. Topics will vary, but may include classical Greece and Rome, Near East and Islam, China and East Asia, South Asia, or Latin America.
