The Blended and Online Learning in Schools (BOLS) is a fully-online graduate program that offers a Graduate Certificate (16 credits) and a Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction (30 credits). Based on teaching standards established by the International Association for K-12 Online Learning (iNACOL), both graduate options focus on the unique demands of teaching courses that blend online and face-to-face instruction or teaching fully-online courses. Both graduate options are also designed to benefit teachers regardless of their online and blended teaching experience or the grade levels that they teach. As a result, the program helps experienced blended/online teachers improve their practice, as well as face-to-face teachers to begin blending online learning elements into their face-to-face courses or transition into teaching fully-online courses.

## **Graduate Options at a Glance**

#### Master's Degree

- Primary focus on teaching and designing online/blended courses
- Delivered fully online
- 30 credits
- 2 years to complete (6 semesters)
- Offered in Fall, Spring, and Summer

#### **Graduate Certificate**

- Primary focus on teaching online/blended courses
- Delivered fully online
- 16 credits
- 2 years to complete (4 semesters)
- Offered in Fall and Spring

## **Program Highlights**

- Fully online: By offering the program fully online, participants experience online learning first hand as a learner. Program instructors also model a variety of online practices and instructional designs that promote excellence.
- Flexible: Courses are primarily offered asynchronously and some allow students to complete the course early.
- Affordable: Tuition discounts are available for in-state and out-of-state students. Most courses do not require students to purchase textbooks. Students are also not required to purchase expensive technology programs to complete course projects.
- High touch: Instructors provide a high level of feedback and support to all students.
- Community of learners: Students regularly collaborate and interact with other students in the program.
- Authentic and applicable: All courses are based on authentic projects—not tests. In fact, most students find that they earn credit for work that they are already doing in their current teaching placement.
- No entrance exam: Students are not required to provide a GRE score.

### **Application Information**
