Author Guidelines

1. SUBMISSION

Thank you for your interest in the Journal of Inclusive Postsecondary Education. Submission implies that the content has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere.

Once you have prepared your submission in accordance with the Guidelines, manuscripts should be submitted to the JIPE Editorial Team via email jipe@gmu.edu.

2. AIMS AND SCOPE

The mission of the Journal of Inclusive Postsecondary Education is to publish original research on the topic of inclusive postsecondary education for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This outlet will provide a forum for qualitative, single subject, quantitative, and mixed methodological studies conducted with a university, community college, or related post-secondary environment.

We welcome quality academic papers on these and other topics for submission to our panel of peer reviewers.

Review articles may be published where they make a clear contribution to knowledge.

The Journal of Inclusive Postsecondary Education is a key resource for practitioners, policy-makers and scholars seeking an understanding of college opportunities for individuals with intellectual and development disability.

The Journal of Inclusive Postsecondary Education is published with an independent editorial board.

All submissions that fit within this scope will be reviewed by the Editors-In-Chief to determine eligibility to move on to Peer Review.

3. MANUSCRIPT REQUIREMENTS

Manuscripts must be no more than 30 pages in length, including abstract, references and tables. Manuscripts should be double-spaced, 12-point font with 1-inch margins.

The manuscript should be submitted in separate files: Authors Details page; main text file; figures.

The Authors Details page should contain:

- i. Full title, short title and the names and affiliations of all authors
- ii. Full address information, including e-mail, telephone and fax, of the corresponding author(s)
- iii. Name(s) of any sponsor(s) of the research contained in the article, along with grant number(s)

Main Text File

As papers are double-blind peer reviewed the main text file should not include any information that might identify the authors.

The main text file should be presented in the following order:

- i. Title, abstract and key words;
- ii. Main text;
- iii. References;
- iv. Tables (each table complete with title and footnotes);
- v. Figures
- vi. Appendices (if relevant).

Figures and supporting information should be supplied as separate files.

The main manuscript file should include an abstract of up to 100 words.

Please provide 3 to 5 keywords.

References should follow APA Format.
