Eligibility

- Have an intellectual disability. Intellectual disability is a disability characterized by significant limitations both in intellectual functioning and in adaptive behavior as expressed in conceptual, social, and practical adaptive skills.
- Have not received a standard high school diploma; however, students who earned a regular diploma based upon successful completion of their IEP and passing scores on state exit exams, but have not earned the standard admissions criteria for college are eligible applicants.
- Are 18 to 29 years of age.
- Have a desire to receive transition services in a college setting.
- Have exhibited a need and a desire for greater independence.
- Are able to communicate with others.

- 2 letters of recommendation by way of an online questionnaire
- 3 hour training
- Monthly circle meetings
- Complete evaluations 3 times per semester
- Additional training materials posted on Blackboard
