Do you have experience teaching students with disabilities? Do you have experience supervising special education teachers? Are you interested in helping to prepare future special educators? If so, apply to be a University Supervisor in Mason's Special Education teacher licensure programs!

The Division of Special Education and disAbility Research at GMU is seeking qualified University Supervisors for teacher candidates completing internships in two of our teacher licensure programs:

- Special Education for Students who Access the General Curriculum (i.e., students with mild/moderate disabilities who access the general curriculum through VA Standards of Learning [SOLs] and participate in SOL assessments)
- Special Education for Students who Access the Adapted Curriculum (i.e., students with severe disabilities who access the adapted curriculum through VA Aligned Standards of Learning [ASOLs] and participate in the Virginia Alternate Assessment Program [VAAP])

University Supervisors are responsible for overseeing teacher candidates' internships in special education settings, including conducting lesson observations, providing coaching on instructional techniques, and working together with Mason faculty and school professionals to effectively support and prepare candidates to teach K-12 students with disabilities.
