**Internship Application Information:** Student teaching is done in the final spring semester in a school assigned by the program. Employment during school hours will be impossible during the spring. Students **must** pass all education coursework taken up to the point of application with a C or better and meet the application deadlines before earning approval to register for the internship course. Fingerprinting and background check will be done through the school district. **To enroll in internship, you must apply and complete these requirements by the application deadline, September 15.** 

**Accelerated Master's Option:** The Accelerated Master's option allows students to double-count up to 12 credits toward their bachelor's and master's and earn their Master's with as few as 18 additional credits. For their MEd, Special Education students can learn about another special education teacher area, or a specialty such as ABA, autism or AT. Students apply for this option after completing 60 credits. A GPA of 3.0 or higher is required for admission. Interested students should speak with an advisor prior to starting their Junior year for details.
