COURSES TAUGHT IN HIGHER EDUCATION

GEORGE MASON UNIVERSITY

Introduction to Kinesiology (KINE 100)

- Undergraduate level
- This course provides students with an overview of the field of kinesiology in the form of an introductory course. It exposes students to the history of the field, and its emphasis on evidence-based knowledge. I also explain policies and procedures for the major and introduce career options in the kinesiology field.

Master's Thesis (SRST 799)

- Graduate level
- This course provides students with the opportunity to explore a sport and recreation problem using appropriate research methodology.

Independent Study in Sport and Recreation Studies (SRST 599)

- Graduate level- master's
- This course provides students with the opportunity to study a problem area in sport and recreation studies research, theory, or practice.

Managing Intercollegiate Athletics (SPMT 480)

- Undergraduate and graduate level
- This course provides students with a conceptual and practical understanding of the administration and management of intercollegiate athletic programs. Students integrate historical, legal, financial, educational, and diversity related issues, current events and practical experiences to develop a comprehensive understanding of intercollegiate sport administration.

Diversity and Inclusion Issues in Sport (SPMT 318)

- Undergraduate level
- This course provides students with the opportunity to learn about sport participant and employee diversity and inclusive practices; and how differences based on religion, disability, socioeconomic class, sex, gender, sexual orientation and racial hierarchies impacts historical and current sport experiences and outcomes.

Introduction to Sport Management (SPMT 201)

- Undergraduate level (online and on campus)
- This course introduced students to the sport management profession. The primary focus was on the sport industry, including professional sport entertainment, amateur sport entertainment, for-profit sport participation, nonprofit sport participation, sporting goods, and sport services.

Research Design and Statistical Reasoning (SRST 623)

- Graduate level
- This course introduced students to the basic principles of scientific and scholarly inquiry in Sport and Recreation Studies. Explored the logic and practice of methods and techniques employed in research related to sport and recreation.

UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS, URBANA/CHAMPAIGN

Ethical Issues in Sport Management (RST 255)

- Undergraduate level
- This course exposed students to prevailing ethical issues in the sports domain. The focus of this course was on the theoretical and practical application of social issues and ethics that are relevant to the various stakeholders in sport (e.g. administrators, coaches, spectators, media, athletes, etc.).

Human Resource Management in Leisure Organizations (RST 420)

- Undergraduate level
- This course provided students with theory, principles, and techniques of personnel management in recreation, sport and tourism service organizations.

Human Resource Management in Recreation, Sport and Tourism, Organizations (RST 512)

- Graduate level (online and on campus)
- This course provided students with practical and theoretical knowledge of strategic human resource planning, personnel law, selection, human resource development, performance management and appraisal, and employee/employer rights and responsibilities.

Intercollegiate Athletics (RST 594 IA)

- Graduate level
- This course is designed to provide a conceptual and practical understanding of historical, legal, financial, educational, and diversity related issues pertaining to the management of Division I, II, and III intercollegiate athletic programs.

Sport Management (KINE 333)

- Undergraduate level
- This course provided students with an introduction to techniques for proper management of physical education instructional programs, intercollegiate and interscholastic athletics, intramural and club programs, and alternative athletic programs such as corporate fitness centers and YMCA's.

KINE 319: Sociology of Sport (KINE 319)

- Teaching Assistant
- Undergraduate level (online)
